### Largest Attack

On Tuesday, a suicide bomber targeted a wedding hall in <u>Kabul</u>, killing fifty-five and injuring ninety-four. The attack occurred around 6:15 pm at the venue, where people had gathered for a celebration marking the birthday of the Prophet Mohammed.

### Attackers

Al-Shabaab is suspected in four attacks this week. On Tuesday, a car bomb detonated in a busy area of Mogadishu, injuring two people. The same day, the group abducted one person and injured four more in Chakama, Kenya. On Thursday, two civilians were abducted by al Shabaab in Koton, Kenya. On Friday, three soldiers were killed in an IED attack in Darusalam, Somalia.

**Baloch Liberation Army (BLA)** claimed one attack this week. On Friday two people were killed and one more injured in an attack on the Chinese consulate in <u>Karachi</u>.

**Bangsamoro Islamic Freedom Fighters (BIFF)** are suspected in two attacks this week, both in the Philippines. On Monday, two soldiers were injured by an IED attack in <u>Labu-Labu</u>. The same day, two attackers shot at a police checkpoint in <u>Barrio Dos</u>, Tacurong City, but didn't hit anyone.

**Boko Haram** is suspected in two attacks this week. On Thursday, eight people were killed and five injured when Boko Haram attacked a well in <u>Diffa</u>, Niger. The next day, fifty loggers were abducted in <u>Bulakesa</u>village in Nigeria by Boko Haram

**Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS)** claimed three attacks and are suspected in two more. On Thursday, ISIS launched an attack against the Syrian Arab Army (SAA) in the <u>Homs governate</u>, Syria, killing ten soldiers. The same day, an IED killed three students and injured two in <u>Ninevah Province</u>, Iraq. ISIS is suspected in both attacks, but no definitive claim has been made. On Friday, a bomb killed thirty-one people and injured fifty-one more in <u>Kalya</u>,


Pakistan. The same day, nine were killed and eleven injured in an attack on a police station in <a href="Tazirbu">Tazirbu</a>, Libya. On Saturday, an ISIS suicide bomber killed twenty-seven soldiers at an army mosque in <a href="Mandozai">Mandozai</a>, Afghanistan.

Naxals claimed one attack this week. On Monday, two people were injured in an IED attack on <a href="Sukma">Sukma</a>, India.

PKK is suspected in one attack this week. On Sunday, a Turkish soldier was injured by a PKK rocket attack in <a href="Igdir">Igdir</a>.

Ugandan Allied Democratic Forces are suspected in one attack this week. On Thursday, members fired on a UN helicopter in the DRC's <a href="Semuliki Valley">Semuliki Valley</a>. No casualties were reported.

**United Liberation Front of Assam (ULFA)** is also suspected in one attack. On Thursday, a grenade blast by the United Liberation Front of Assam (ULFA) killed two and injured two others in the Sivasagar district of Assam, India.



## Regions

Middle East

**Afghanistan** suffered two attacks this week. On Tuesday, a suicide bomber targeted a wedding hall in <u>Kabul</u>, killing fifty-five and injuring ninety-four. This was the week's largest attack. On Saturday an ISIS suicide bomber killed twenty-seven soldiers at an army mosque in <u>Mandozai</u>.

**Iraq** was hit by one attack on Thursday, when an IED killed three students and injured two in Ninevah Province. The IED was planted by ISIS.

**Syria** suffered two attacks this week. On Thursday, ISIS launched an attack against the Syrian Arab Army (SAA) in the <u>Homs governate</u>, killing ten soldiers. The next day, two Syrian activists were killed in <u>Kafr Nabel</u>.

#### Africa

**Democratic Republic of the Congo** suffered one attack on Thursday, when Ugandan Allied Democratic Forces members fired on a UN helicopter in the <u>Semuliki Valley</u>. No casualties were reported.

Kenya was hit by two attacks this week. On Tuesday, the group abducted one person and injured four more

in <u>Chakama</u>. Two civilians were abducted in <u>Koton</u> two days later. Al-Shabaab is suspected in both attacks. **Libya** suffered one attack on Friday, when ISIS killed nine and injured eleven in an attack on a police station in <u>Tazirbu</u>. **Niger** suffered one attack this week. On Thursday, eight people were killed and five injured when Boko Haram attacked a well in <u>Diffa</u>, Niger.

Nigeria was also hit by a Boko Haram attack. On Friday, the group abducted fifty loggers from <u>Bulakesa</u>village.

Somalia suffered two attacks this week. On Tuesday, a car bomb detonated in a busy area of <u>Mogadishu</u>, injuring two people. On Friday, three soldiers were killed in an IED attack in <u>Darusalam</u>. Al-Shabaab is suspected in both attacks.

#### Asia Pacific

India was hit by five attacks this week. On Monday, two people were injured in an IED attack on Sukma, India. On Thursday, a grenade blast by the United Liberation Front of Assam (ULFA) killed two and injured two others in the Sivasagar district of Assam. On Thursday, a grenade was hurled into the tent housing members of the police in Shopian district. There was one civilian injury, and no one has taken responsibility for the attack. On Thursday, suspected terrorists attacked an Indian Army outpost in Kulgam district. No casualties reported, and the responsible party is unknown. On Friday, a grenade attack at a congressman's home in Tral, but left no casualties.


Pakistan also suffered five attacks this week. On Wednesday, an IED explosion injured nine people at a mosque in Chaman. The same day, a roadside blast in Nawagai killed two. On Thursday, a bomb killed three people in the tribal areas bordering Afghanistan. No group has claimed responsibility. On Friday, a bomb killed thirty-one people and injured fifty-one more in Kalya. The same day two people were killed and one more injured in an attack on the Chinese consulate in Karachi.

**Philippines** was hit by two attacks this week. Bangsamoro Islamic Freedom Fighters (BIFF) are suspected in both. On Monday, two soldiers were injured by an IED attack in <u>Labu-Labu</u>. The same day, two attackers shot at a police checkpoint in <u>Barrio Dos</u>, Tacurong City, but didn't hit anyone.

#### Western Europe and Others

Turkey was hit by one attack this week. On Sunday, a Turkish soldier was killed by a PKK rocket attack in Igdir.
