
Noteworthy

Afghanistan, Pakistan, and Yemen were all hit with midsized attacks targeting soldiers this week. In Afghanistan, eleven were killed and sixteen were wounded when ISIS <u>attacked</u> soldiers guarding a military academy in the early morning. The TTP <u>attacked</u> soldiers in Pakistan by exploding a suicide bomb near the sports area of a military base. Eleven were killed and thirteen injured. Finally, in Yemen, fifteen were killed when a <u>suicide bomber</u> drove an explosive laden vehicle into a military checkpoint.

Boko Haram carried out carried out four attacks, two in Cameroon, one in Nigeria, and one in Niger. In Nigeria, two suicide bombers attacked an IDP camp near Maiduguri, killing five and injuring thirty-nine. Naxalites carried out three attacks, all in India.

Unknown attackers were responsible for thirteen attacks that killed twenty-five and injured forty-seven. The largest of these was a <u>car-bombing</u> in southwest Syria that injured twenty-four.

From last week, total attacks decreased by 29%, fatalities decreased by 60%, and injuries decreased by 69%.
