Largest Attack

This week's largest attack occurred in Ahvaz, Iran, where four gunmen opened fire on a military parade. Twenty-nine people were killed and fifty-seven injured. ISIS claimed it had carried out the attack, but a new group, Ahvaz National Resistance, also claimed the attack.

Attackers

Al-Shabab claimed one attack this week, a twin car bombing in <u>Mogadishu</u> that killed one and injured another. The group says they were targeting a police official who was not among the casualties.

Boko Haram is suspected in one attack in <u>Kalari Abdiye</u>, a village in Nigeria's Borno State. Attackers killed nine and injured nine more.

Hizbul Mujahideen claimed an attack in <u>Kapran</u>, India. The group kidnapped four police officers and killed three of them.

The Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS) claimed one attack and are suspected in two more. On Wednesday in Manbij, Syria the group claimed an IED attack that hit a vehicle belonging to the Manbij Military Council's Intelligence Unit. The same day, suspected ISIS militants destroyed an electrical transmission tower in Hawija, Iraq. On Friday ISIS attacked Iraq again. This time, militants broke into a mayor's home in Mosul, killed him and another inhabitant and injured his son.


The Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS) and the Ahvaz National Resistance, a new group, are disputing one attack in Ahvaz, Iran, where four gunmen opened fire on a military parade. Twenty-nine people were killed and fifty-seven injured.

Naxals are suspected in two attacks this week, both in India. On Friday, a police officer was injured by an IED in <u>Bijapur</u>. On Sunday, suspected Naxals killed two political officials in <u>Visakhapatnam</u>.

The **New People's Army** are also suspected in two attacks this week, both in the Philippines. On Tuesday, a landmine injured seven soldiers in <u>Buenavista</u>. The same day, suspected NPA militants attacked a police station in <u>Butuan</u>, injuring one.

The **Taliban** are suspected in one attack in <u>Shirin Tagab</u>, Afghanistan, where an IED outside a police station killed nine children and injured four more.

Five attacks were carried out by unknown attackers.

On Friday ISIS attacked Iraq again. This time, militants broke into a mayor's home in Mosul, killed him and another inhabitant and injured his son.

Syria was hit by one attack in Manbij, where an IED attack hit a vehicle belonging to the Manbij Military Council's Intelligence Unit. ISIS claimed the attack.

Africa


Nigeria suffered one attack this week in <u>Kalari Abdiye</u>, a village in Nigeria's Borno State. Suspected Boko Haram miltants killed nine and injured nine more.

Somalia was hit by one attack as well, a twin car bombing in <u>Mogadishu</u> that killed one and injured another. Al-Shabaab claimed the attack and said they were targeting a police official who was not among the casualties.

Asia-Pacific

India was hit by six attacks this week, the most of any country. On Monday, a soldier was killed in his home in Churat.
On Tuesday, one soldiers was injured when a grenade was thrown at a CPRF military base in Newa. In similar attack the next day, unknown attackers threw a grenade at a police station in Kakapora, but left no casualties. On Fridday, Hizbul Mujahideen kidnapped four police officers and killed three of them in Kapran. The same day, a police officer was injured by an IED in Bijapur. On Sunday, suspected Naxals killed two political officials in Visakhapatnam. The Philippines suffered two attacks this week. On Tuesday, a landmine injured seven soldiers in Buenavista. The same day, suspected NPA militants attacked a police station in Butuan, injuring one. The New People's Army are suspected in both attacks.
