Largest Attack

On Tuesday a car bomb killed six and injured thirty in <u>Qayyarah</u>, Iraq. The vehicle was parked outside a crowded restaurant. Authorities are blaming ISIS, but no group has claimed responsibility.

Attackers

Abu Sayyaf is suspected in one attack this week in Jolo, Philippines, where they abducted a teacher.


Boko Haram claimed one attack and is suspected in one more. On Monday, suspected Boko Haram militants raided <u>Mifah</u> village, killing two and injuring six. On Saturday, attackers shot at a military base in<u>Borno</u>, Nigeria killing one and injuring four. Boko Haram claimed the attack.

The Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS) claimed one attack an is suspected in three more. On Monday, a suspected ISIS IED killed one person outside of <u>Homs</u>, Syria. The next day, a car bomb killed six and injured thirty in <u>Qayyarah</u>, Iraq. This was the week's largest attack. On Saturday, an ambush on police in <u>al-Tarfawi</u> killed one. ISIS claimed an attack <u>al-Foqha</u>, Libya that killed four local government and police officials. Ten more people were injured in the Sunday attack.

Naxalites are suspected in two attacks this week. On Saturday, an IED in <u>Bijapur</u>, India killed five CPRF soldiers and injured one more. The next day, suspected Naxals targeted politician Nandal Mudiyami in his home in <u>Palnar</u>, India, leaving him critically injured.

The New People's Army (NPA) is suspected in one attack in <u>Mainit</u>, Philippines. Attackers killed one soldier and injured one more.

Taliban claimed two attacks this week, both in Afghanistan. On Monday an attacker killed one NATO soldier and injured two others in <u>Shindand</u>. The Taliban claimed an attack in <u>Maidan-Shar</u>, Afghanistan, where a suicide bomber on



Middle East

Afghanistan suffered two attacks this week, both of which were claimed by the Taliban. On Monday an attacker killed one NATO soldier and injured two others in <u>Shindand</u>. On Saturday, a suicide bomber in <u>Maidan-Shar</u> targeted a police bus, killing five and injuring ten.

Iraq was hit by two attacks this week. On Tuesday a car bomb killed six and injured thirty in <u>Qayyarah</u>, Iraq. This was the week's largest attack. On Saturday, a policeman was killed in <u>al-Riyadh</u> by ISIS militants during their attack on a police patrol. Several others are expected to have been killed as well, but the number is unknown.

Israel suffered an attack in Juhor ad-Dik, where and IED detonated on Monday. No casualties resulted.

Syria was hit by one attack on Monday, when a suspected ISIS IED killed one person outside of Homs.

Africa

Libya suffered one attack this week in <u>al-Foqha</u> where four local government and police officials were killed. Ten more people were injured in the Sunday attack, for which ISIS claimed responsibility.

Mali was hit by two attacks. On Sunday, a roadside bomb in <u>Konna</u> killed two UN Peacekeepers. Another peacekeeping mission was attacked the same day in <u>Ber</u>, where two peacekeepers were killed and five injured by militants wielding firearms, grenades, and rockets.

Nigeria also suffered two attacks. On Monday, suspected Boko Haram militants raided <u>Mifah</u> village, killing two and injuring six. Boko Haram claimed an attack on Saturday, in which attackers shot at a military base in <u>Borno</u> killing one and injuring four.

Somalia


India suffered five attacks this week. Several separate attacks occured on Friday. One person was killed in a grenade attack in <u>Wagoora Nowgam</u> in Srinagar. A soldier was stoned to death by a mob in <u>Anantnag District</u>. Two were killed in two separate terrorist attacks in <u>Malgunipura</u>, <u>Sopore</u> One person was killed in an attack on an Army camp in <u>Luragam</u>. In all incidents, the militants' affiliations are unknown. On Saturday, an IED in <u>Bijapur</u> killed five CPRF soldiers and injured one more. The next day, suspected Naxals targeted politician Nandal Mudiyami in his home in <u>Palnar</u>, leaving him critically injured.

Pakistan was hit by two attacks. On Tuesday, 4 civilians were shot after being abducted in <u>North Waziristan</u>. In a separate incident, 2 others were injured in an attack on a security check post in <u>Khola Tehsil</u>. The responsible party for the attacks is unknown.

The Philippines suffered three attacks.

A teacher was abducted from <u>Jolo</u> on Monday. Abu Sayyaf is suspected in the attack. The same day, suspected NPA attackers killed one soldier and injured one more in <u>Mainit</u>. On Friday, twin roadside bombs detonated near military trucks in <u>Datu Saudi-Ampatuan</u>, but left no casualties.
