Largest Attack

On Friday, a car bomb detonated in a market in <u>Al-Qa'im</u>, Iraq, killing two and injuring twenty-five. No claim of responsibility has been made, but authorities suspect ISIS is involved.

Attackers

Al-Qaeda in the Arabian Peninsula (AQAP) is suspected in one attack this week. A roadside bomb targeted a civilian vehicle in <u>Al-Mahfed</u>, Yemen, killing two and injuring twelve.


Al-Shabaab is also suspected in one attack. An IED was attached to a car belonging to a Senator's son in<u>Mogadishu</u>, Somalia, leaving one person injured.

The Islamic State in Iraq and Syria (ISIS) claimed one attack and is suspected in one more. On Monday, ISIS militants fired into a military base in <u>Raqqa</u>, Syria, killing five. The next day in <u>Hama</u>, Syria, a suspected-ISIS landmine hit a civilian vehicle, killing three and injuring five. On Friday, a car bomb detonated in a market in <u>Al-Qa'im</u>, Iraq, killing two and injuring twenty-five. This was the week's largest attack.

Jaish-e-Mohammed claimed an attack in <u>Lalchowk</u>, India, where a grenade was thrown at a military camp on Friday. No casualties resulted.

Naxals are suspected in one attack this week. On Tuesday, a victim was abducted from his home in<u>Niche Kamta</u>, India. A note left on his body claimed he was a police informer.

The **Taliban** claimed two attacks and are suspected in one more, all in Afghanistan. On Monday, an explosion in a residential neighborhood in <u>Janikhel</u> killed six and injured six more. On Saturday, Taliban members fired on a police station in <u>Pul-e-Rangina</u>, killing six. The same day, militants fired on a military checkpoint in <u>Spin Bolduk</u>, killing five and injuring two. The Taliban claimed both attacks.



Middle East

Afghanistan suffered four attacks this week. On Monday, an explosion in a residential neighborhood inJanikhel killed six and injured six more. The next day an explosion in a public market in <u>Khost</u> killed two and injured twenty-three. On Saturday, Taliban members fired on a police station in <u>Pul-e-Rangina</u>, killing six. The same day, militants fired on a military checkpoint in <u>Spin Bolduk</u>, killing five and injuring two. The Taliban claimed both attacks. **Iraq** was hit by two attacks this week. On Tuesday, a car bomb near a police checkpoint in <u>Tikrit</u> killed two and injured six. On Friday, a car bomb detonated in a market in <u>Al-Qa'im</u>, Iraq, killing two and injuring twenty-five. **Syria** suffered two attacks this week. On Monday, ISIS militants fired into a military base in <u>Raqqa</u>, killing five. The next day in <u>Hama</u>, a suspected-ISIS landmine hit a civilian vehicle, killing three and injuring five.

Yemen was hit by one attack. A roadside bomb targeted a civilian vehicle in Al-Mahfed, killing two and injuring

twelve.

Africa

Burkina Faso was hit by one attack this week. Militants attacked <u>Gasseliki</u> village, killing twelve and injuring two more.

The **Democratic Republic of the Congo** suffered one attack this week. Militants raided <u>Mavavi</u> on Monday with guns and machetes, killing ten and injuring one.

Somalia suffered one attack this week. An IED was attached to a car belonging to a Senator's son in<u>Mogadishu</u>, leaving one person injured.


Asia Pacific

India suffered three attacks this week. Jaish-e-Mohammed claimed an attack in <u>Lalchowk</u>, where a grenade was thrown at a military camp on Friday. No casualties resulted.On Tuesday, a man was abducted from his home in <u>Niche Kamta</u>. A note left on his body claimed he was a police informer. On Saturday, an IED in <u>Rajouri</u> killed two soldiers.

Pakistan was hit by one attack this week. On Friday, militants threw an IED at police personnel in <u>Dera Ismail Khan</u>, injuring two.

Thailand suffered four attacks this week. On Tuesday, a car owner was abducted and killed in <u>Saba Yoi</u>before his car was used as a bomb. The same day, militants attacked security officers guarding a school in <u>Pattani</u>, killing four. On Wednesday, a bomb targeted a protection unit for teachers in nearby <u>Yarang</u>, injuring two. The same day, an IED in a pickup truck detonated in <u>Thepa</u>, also injuring two people.
