Largest Attack

On Thursday, an attacker lobbed a grenade into a bus stand in in [Jammu and Kashmir](#). Thirty-four people sustained injuries, and two of that group later succumbed to their wounds. Police apprehended the attacker, who said he was working on behalf of Hizbul Mujahideen.

Attackers

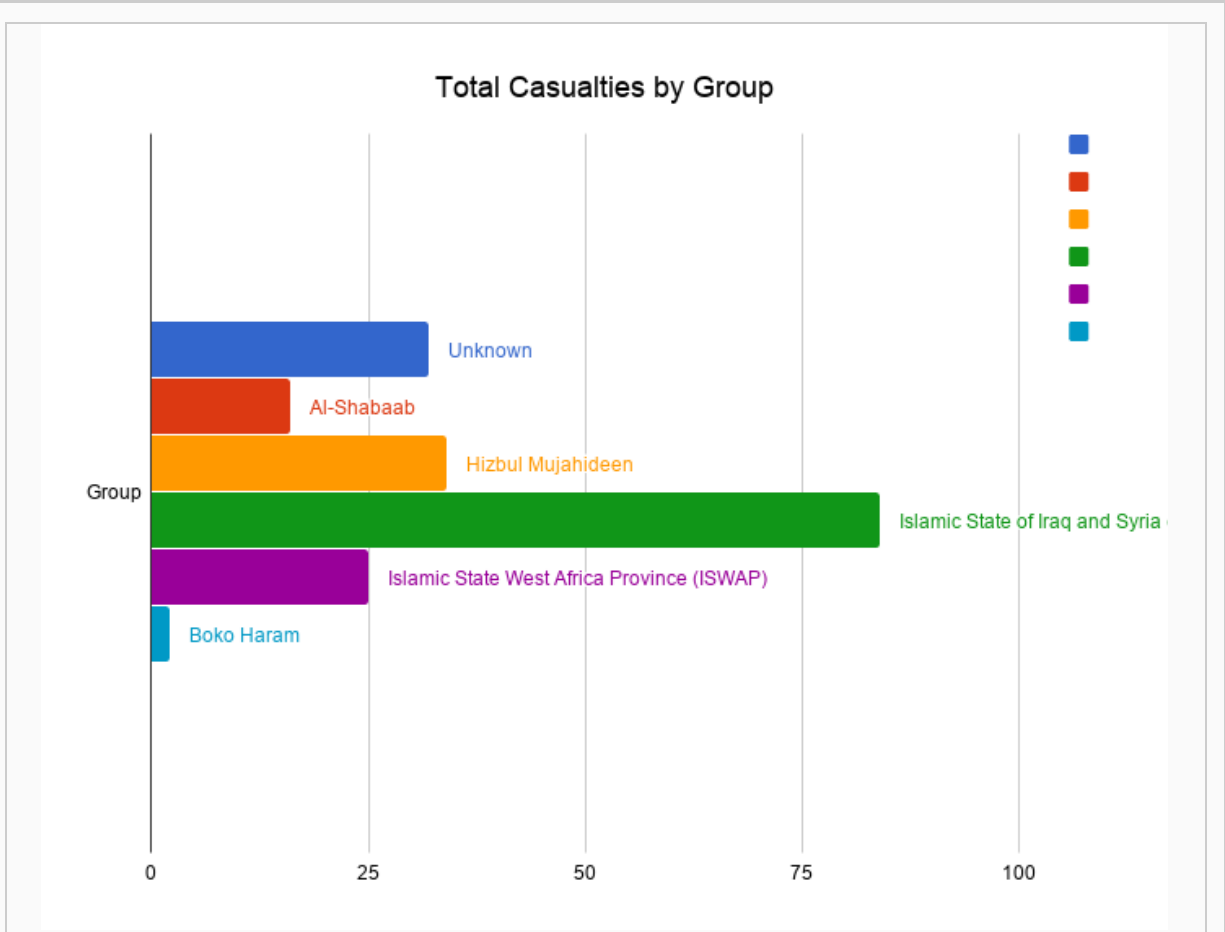
Al-Shabaab claimed one attack this week on Thursday, when a car bomb in [Mogadishu](#) killed seven and injured nine.

Boko Haram is suspected in one attack this week. Two female suicide bombers targeted a crowd of Christians preparing for mass in [Shuwa](#), Nigeria. Their bombs exploded prematurely, but two people were killed.

Hizbul Mujahideen is suspected in a grenade attack on a bus stand in [Jammu and Kashmir](#), India. Two people were killed and thirty-two injured in the Thursday attack.

The Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS) claimed two attacks and are suspected in two more. On Thursday, the group claimed a bombing in [Kabul](#). Three people were killed and twenty-two injured. The same day, suspected ISIS militants attacked a bus carrying Shiite militia members in [Mosul](#), Iraq, killing six and injuring thirty-one. On Friday, [Mosul](#) was attacked again when suspected ISIS militants set off a car bomb, killing two people and injuring ten. On Saturday, an ISIS suicide car bomber detonated himself near a military vehicle in [Manbij](#), Syria, injuring eight people.

The Islamic State in West African Province (ISWAP) is suspected in an attack on Wednesday, when a vehicle carrying several farmers hit a landmine in [Maiduguri](#), Nigeria, killing five and injuring twenty.



Regions

Middle East

Afghanistan was hit by three attacks this week. On Wednesday, suicide bombers and gunmen attacked a construction company in [Jalalabad](#), killing sixteen of its employees and injuring nine more. On Thursday, ISIS claimed a bombing in [Kabul](#). Three people were killed and twenty-two injured. On Sunday, an IED in [Herat](#) injured five people.

Iraq suffered two attacks this week. On Thursday, suspected ISIS militants attacked a bus carrying Shiite militia members in [Mosul](#), Iraq, killing six and injuring thirty-one. The next day, [Mosul](#) was attacked again when suspected ISIS militants set off a car bomb, killing two people and injuring ten.

Israel was hit by one attack this week. A car-ramming in [N'ima](#) injured two people.

Syria suffered one attack as well. On Saturday, an ISIS suicide car bomber detonated himself near a military vehicle in [Manbij](#), injuring eight people.

Africa

Nigeria suffered two attacks this week. The Islamic State in West African Province (ISWAP) is suspected in an attack on Wednesday, when a vehicle carrying several farmers hit a landmine in [Maiduguri](#), Nigeria, killing five and injuring

twenty. On Sunday, two Boko Haram suicide bombers targeted a crowd of Christians preparing for mass in [Shuwa](#), Nigeria. Their bombs exploded prematurely, but two people were killed.

Somalia was hit by one attack when a car bomb in [Mogadishu](#) killed seven and injured nine. Al-Shabaab later claimed the bombing.

Asia Pacific
