
Largest Attack

On Friday, a white nationalist attacked two mosques in <u>Christchurch</u>, New Zealand before being stopped by police, killing fifty people.

Attackers

Al-Shabaab is suspected in one attack this week. An IED exploded in a market place in <u>Bay</u>, Somalia on Wednesday, killing eight and injuring forty.

The New People's Army (NPA) claimed an attack this week. A group of armed militants burned heavy equipment at a pineapple plantation in <u>San Nicolas</u>, Philippines, but left no casualties.



Regions

Middle East

Afghanistan was hit by two attacks this week. On Tuesday, a car bomb targeted an Afghan journalist in <u>Lashkargah</u>. The journalist survived but was injured. On Saturday, another car bomb detonated prematurely in <u>Kabul</u>, killing one and injuring one more.

Syria suffered one attack this week on Tuesday, when unknown militants fired rockets into <u>Aleppo</u>, killing one and injuring four.

Africa

Somalia suffered one attack this week. An IED exploded in a market place in <u>Bay</u> on Wednesday, killing eight and injuring forty. Al-Shabaab is suspected in the attack.

Asia Pacific

Pakistan suffered one attack this week. On Monday, a bomb attached to a motorcycle detonated near a police vehicle in <u>Quetta</u>, injuring four vehicles.

Philippines suffered one attack this week. New People's Army (NPA) militants burned heavy equipment at a pineapple plantation in <u>San Nicolas</u>, Philippines, but left no casualties.

Thailand was hit by its first attack since January. Three security officials were injured in an attack on a border defense unit in <u>Tak Bai</u> on Saturday.

Western Europe and Others

New Zealand suffered one attack this week in <u>Christchurch</u>. A white nationalist attacked two mosques before being stopped by police, killing fifty people. This was the week's largest attack.
