# Largest Attack

On Monday, a suspected Al-Shabaab militant drove a bomb-laden car into an African Union Convoy in Afgoye, Somalia, killing twelve and injuring twenty-seven. Al-Shabaab leadership did not claimed the attack, but praised it.

## Attackers

**Al-Shabaab** is suspected in two attacks this week, both in Somalia. On Monday, an attacker rammed a bomb-ladden car into an African Union convoy in Afgoye. On Thursday, a roadside bomb killed five KDF soldiers in Elwak.


**Boko Haram** is suspected in four attacks this week. The group planted a roadside mine that exploded when a car struck the device on Monday in <u>Gwoza</u>, Nigeria. Eight people were killed and seven injured. The same day, Boko Haram terrorists arrived on motorcycles with firearms and then robbed and burned a bank in <u>Michika</u>, Nigeria. On Tuesday, the group injured two people in a car bombing <u>Mogadishu</u>. The same day, militants in trucks fired on farmers in <u>Lassa</u>, Nigeria, killing four.

**Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS)** claimed one attack and are suspected in one more. The group ambushed Iraqi forces north of <u>Baghdad</u>, Iraq on Tuesday. Gunmen opened fire on the military force, killing two and injuring six others. On Thursday, a series of bombings near a Shiite shrine in <u>Kabul</u> killed six and injured twenty-three.

Naxalites are suspected in three attacks this week, all in India. On Monday, an IED blast killed one and injured four others in Aranpur. The same day, Naxals ambushed the Central Reserve Police Force in Dantewada, while they were on security duty. The group killed one and injured five in an IED attack. On Wednesday, an IED attack in Peddakodepal injured nine.

The PKK is suspected in a car bombing in <u>Jarabulus</u>, Syria on Tuesday that killed one person.

**Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan** (**TTP**) claimed one attack this week. The group killed six people in a remote security post in **Ziarat**, Pakistan on Wednesday.



# Regions

Middle East

**Afghanistan** suffered one attack this week. On Thursday, a series of bombings near a Shiite shrine in <u>Kabul</u> killed six and injured twenty-three.

Iraq was also hit by one attack. The Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS) ambushed Iraqi forces north of <u>Baghdad</u>, on Tuesday. ISIS gunmen opened fire on the military force, killing two and injuring six others.

**Syria** suffered one attack this week. The PKK is suspected in a car bombing in <u>Jarabulus</u>, Syria on Tuesday that killed one person.

**Yemen** was also hit by one attack this week. A car bomb exploded near a military base on Thursday killed two people in Markha.

#### Africa

**Nigeria** was hit by three attacks this week, all suspected to be the work of Boko Haram. The group planted a roadside mine that exploded when a car struck the device on Monday in <u>Gwoza</u>, Nigeria. Eight people were killed and seven injured. The same day, Boko Haram terrorists arrived on motorcycles with firearms and then robbed and burned a bank

in Michika, Nigeria. On Tuesday, militants in trucks fired on farmers in Lassa, Nigeria, killing four.

**Somalia** suffered three attacks this week. On Monday, a militant from Al-Shabaab rammed a bomb-ladden car into an African Union convoy in <u>Afgoye</u>. The next day, Boko Haram injured two people in a car bombing <u>Mogadishu</u>. On Thursday, a suspected Al-Shabaab roadside bomb killed five KDF soldiers in <u>Elwak</u>.

Asia Pacific


India suffered four attacks this week. On Monday, an IED blast killed one and injured four others in Aranpur. The same day, an ambush on Central Reserve Police Forces in Dantewada killed one and injured five. On Wednesday, an IED attack in Peddakodepal injured nine. Naxalse are suspected in all three attacks. On Thursday, unknown attackers threw a grenade at policemen in Sopore, injuring three.

**Pakistan** was hit by two attacks this week. An unknown group is responsible for planting an IED on a bicycle near a Pakistani military vehicle near in the district of <u>Dera Ismail Kahn</u>. The detonation injured three on Monday. Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) claimed an attack that killed six people in a remote security post in <u>Ziarat</u>, Pakistan on Wednesday.

Western Europe and Others

Netherlands suffered one attack this week. An unknown terrorist shot and killed three people on a tram in Utrecht.
