Three explosions in Kabul killed two and injured twenty-seven on Sunday.

Attackers


Al-Shabaab is suspected of planting a bomb on a vehicle outside a popular restaurant in <u>Mogadishu</u>, Somalia, causing no causalities.

Boko Haram attacked communities in Nigeria near <u>Maiduguri</u> killing six people. They also destroyed homes and livestock.

The Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant (ISIL) claimed four attacks this week. On Friday, the group set fire to farmland in Iraq's Kirkuk province. Farmers who attempted to put out the fire were attacked, causing one causality and seven injuries. The next day, ISIL attacked the Syrian Arab Army in Al-Sukhneh, Syria. Also on Saturday, a suicide car bombing in Baghdad killed five and injured two. On Sunday, three explosions in Kabul killed two and injured twenty-seven.

Naxals claimed one attack in Bastar, India, where a police informer was hacked to death.

The **Taliban** claimed a suicide car bombing in <u>Kabul</u> that killed four and injured three on Friday.



Regions

Middle East

Afghanistan was hit by three attacks this week. On Monday, An unknown group carried out an IED blast that wounded 10 people. The attack targeted a government workers' bus in <u>Kabul</u>. On Friday, the Taliban claimed a suicide car bombing in <u>Kabul</u> that killed four and injured three. On Sunday, three explosions in Kabul killed two and injured twenty-seven.

Iraq suffered one attack this week when ISIL set fire to farmland in the <u>Kirkuk</u> province. Farmers who attempted to put out the fire were attacked, causing one causality and seven injuries.

Syria was hit by one attack this week. On Saturday, ISIL attacked the Syrian Arab Army in Al-Sukhneh, Syria.

Africa

Somalia was hit by one attack this week. Al-Shabaab is suspected of planting a bomb on a vehicle outside a popular restaurant in <u>Mogadishu</u>, causing no causalities.

Kenya suffered one attack this week when an unknown group planted landmines that General Service Unit officers hit in <u>Rahmu</u>. The officers narrowly escaped with no injuries.

Libya was also hit by one attack. Two car bombs targeted a military unit in Derna, injuring eighteen.

Nigeria suffered one attack when Boko Haram attacked communities in near <u>Maiduguri</u> killing six people. They also destroyed homes and livestock.


Asia Pacific

India suffered two attacks this week. On Saturday, in <u>Bastar</u>, India, Naxals hacked a police informer to death. The next day, militants threw a grenade at the home of a Congress leader in <u>Pulwama</u>, but left no casualties.

Pakistan was hit by one attack in <u>North Waziristan</u> where an IED targeted a military vehicle. One soldier was killed.

Thailand suffered one attack this week when an unknown attacker planted a bomb at a busy market in the <u>Pattani</u> province. The explosion killed a woman and a younger boy.
